- **You will be required to place each of your entries following registration.** Please leave sufficient time for this when entering.
- You will be required to adhere strictly to directions and guidelines displayed in the Pavilion during nomination.
- Please advise steward(s) if your flowers may NOT be auctioned Saturday afternoon.

### **Considerations for entering Section**

- a. A "Cut" is a spray of three or more flowers on a terminal bud (buds occurring at the end of the branches).
- b. A "Collection" is judged for quality, freshness and variety, not quantity of one variety.
- c. A "Head" is two or more flowers coming from a terminal stalk
- d. Where possible some foliage must be present on exhibits as it is taken into consideration when judging.

- 1 One Single Colour Rose – Red
- 2 One Single Colour Rose – Yellow
- 3 One Single Colour Rose – White, Cream or Buff
- 4 One Single Colour Rose – Pink
- 5 One Single Colour Rose – Orange or Apricot

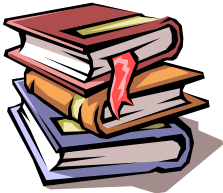

### OPEN FLORAL ART

#### **1. Modern, Contemporary Arrangement**

Arrangement must have defined lines and will be judged on boldness of design, strong contrast in colour and form. The arrangements' lines and design should produce a dramatic impact. *Fresh Flowers must be used.*

#### **2. Backyard Botanical Arrangement**, any design using only flowers and/or foliage from the local area/garden. *NB Only flowers/foilage grown locally can be used. No purchased flowers.*

#### **3. Table arrangement –**

Accessories and candles encouraged but not compulsory. Arrangement must not exceed 30cm in height and will be judged on both practicality and uniqueness. *Fresh Flowers must be used.*

#### **4. The Beauty of Leaves**

this arrangement is foliage only – NO FLOWERS *Fresh Leaves must be used.*

#### **5. Mono Arrangement using a Single Floral Colour only –**

a variety of shades of that colour may be used. Foliage of any colour can be used. *Fresh Flowers must be used.*

#### **6. Solo - Making the most of one Flower.** Arrangement should contain ONE only Flower. *Fresh Flowers must be used.*

#### **7. Seasonal Arrangement inspired by a religious or cultural celebration**

(can include but is not limited to Hannukah, Christmas, Halloween, Easter, Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day)

#### **8. Workplace Wow. Arrangement which reflects the workplace in which is placed.**

Entries must be in a vase.

#### **9. Homage to the Artist: Margaret Olley.** A departure from The Masters this year.

Best known for her still life art and portraits, Margaret Olley's lifelong love of nature is a common theme in her work. Be inspired to create floral art inspired by the work of this respected Australian Artist.

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO READ THESE CONDITIONS CAREFULLY

### ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

1. The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies (qcas.net.au) to the Constitution and Rules of this Society/Association in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this schedule.
2. It is compulsory to complete a Horse Health Declaration for **ALL** horses entering an affiliated agricultural society showgrounds. Horse Health Declarations are available at [www.queenslandshows.com.au](http://www.queenslandshows.com.au) or contact the relevant Agricultural Society.
3. In the event of insufficient competitors in the Ring Events - classes may be run off earlier than stated in the schedule. Please check with the Ring Steward.
4. The Chief Ring Steward shall have the final say in all decisions regarding any event and entrance into any event. Also, the Chief Steward has the ability to alter or remove any event within the 2022 Show Schedule.
5. Nominations will be by ticket system at all events. Tickets are available from the Clerk near the Marshalling Yard Gate.
6. In the event of a **PROTEST** the person making the protest shall make same in writing to the Chief Steward within 30 minutes accompanied by the fee of \$100, this sum to be refunded should the protest be upheld. **Competitors may be asked for proof of age.**
7. **HORSE STABLES:** Due to limited numbers, stables will be available to people outside a radius of 20km of Charleville and to be paid for on booking. Charge of \$5 small & \$10 per large stables. **NOTE:** In the event of a pre-booking being surrendered, it will be the decision of the show society to whom the vacant stables will be re-allocated too.
8. **ABSOLUTELY NO RESPONSIBILITY** shall be taken for prize money once competitors leave the ring.
9. **AMBULANCE** - Competitors and Patrons please note: when available a qualified First Aid Officer will be in attendance on the grounds. However, competitors and patrons are notified that Ambulance transport costs are your own individual responsibility.

10. **CAMPING FEE: \$30**

11. **All competitors and associated people must purchase a Gate Entry ticket to the show - \$15.00 adult - \$10.00 16 years and under and Aged Pensioners - \$50.00 Family 2 adults and up to 4 children.** No one will be allowed through the gate without a pass.

**REGULATIONS**

- 12. **Stallions** eligible to compete in events as designated in program. Rider and handlers of all stallions, whilst on the grounds, must be over the age of 17 years.
- 13. **Maiden:** Horse which has never won a first prize in that discipline (excl. teams) at any agricultural show. **Intermediate:** Horse which has not won a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> place at a Royal Show. **Novice:** Horse who has not won an open championship at an agricultural show or first at a Royal Show. **Pony:** Horse not exceeding 14 hands (unless eligible under relevant breed society). **Galloway:** Horse over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands. **Hack:** Horse over 15 hands. All ponies and galloways must be measured.
- 14. Horses can be shown in Hack Classes or Show Hunter Classes and not in both. Exception is for District Hack events.  
**Note:** Dress, equipment and some class procedures differ between Hack and Show Hunter classes. Please refer to relevant associations for details.
- 15. **District classes** are restricted to riders and horses who resident in Murweh, Paroo, Quilpie, Bulloo, Barcoo and Tambo Shires for a minimum of three months prior to show day.
- 16. Pony Hack and Show Hunter Pony Hacks over 12.2h can be ridden by juvenile or adult. Show and Hunter ponies under 12.2h must be ridden by riders under 17 years. This also applies for championships ie. adults can compete and be eligible for championship providing the pony is over 12.2h.
- 17. Entrants for Ladies and Gents events must be 17 years & over.
- 18. All riders and handlers must be neatly attired, in accordance with the discipline they are competing in. Any contestant, who in the opinion of the Stewards is not suitably attired, shall be precluded from competing in an event.
- 19. **In the event of Horse Ring events clash Chief Ring Steward will give consideration to waiting if program timing permits. Automatic scratching and forfeiture of nomination money left to the discretion of the Chief Ring Steward.**
- 20. For championship events, first in the class only is eligible for the championship. Second prize winners in such classes are to be ready on standby to compete for Reserve Champion once the Champion has been selected.
- 21. **This show reserves the right to carry out random tests for drugs in horses.**
- 22. All Horses to be measured from 3-4pm on Thursday. Saturday competitors see ring steward to organise measurements or ring 0488 000 546.
- 23. All horses must be free of hereditary disease.
- 24. Proof of height must be shown if requested.

## **CHARLEVILLE & SOUTHWEST QLD SHOW SOCIETY INC. REGULATIONS**

**Exhibitors are requested to read these conditions carefully.**

1. It is essential for the smooth running of the Show that entries for all sections be lodged, with the entry fees, with the secretary on or before the dates as shown at the heading of the respective sections. The committee may accept late entries at their discretion.
2. Exhibits in all classes must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
3. Entries must be accompanied by the entrance fee as specified in the schedule, otherwise they will not be accepted, and nomination fee will not be refunded.
4. No person shall be allowed in the vicinity of the judge during judging time, other than the stewards and attendants in charge of stock. No person will be allowed to communicate with the judges other than through a steward.
5. On receipt of entries, the Secretary will issue exhibit tickets which must be the only sign of ownership attached to each exhibit and such ticket shall accompany exhibits. Exhibit tickets for livestock exhibits may be held by the stewards at their discretion and issued when exhibits are being penned.
6. No person shall act as judge except the cases in which he himself is not an exhibitor.
7. Judges may withhold prizes and championship honours if they think it expedient.
8. The decision of the judges shall be final.

9. The committee reserves the right to withhold or modify any prize or prizes should there be three or less individual competitors in any class or event.
10. Prize ribbons and tickets shall be affixed to exhibits as soon as the judges have made their awards.
11. All horses and ponies exhibited at the show shall be paraded in the Grand Parade, at a day and time to be decided by the committee. No ribbons other than those won at the Society's current Show are to be worn or displayed.
12. Every care of the exhibits will be taken, but the Society will not be responsible for any losses or death, and exhibits must be brought to and removed from the grounds by the exhibitor.
13. Exhibits must be delivered to Showgrounds in the manner and time prescribed at the heading of each section. Non-compliance with this provision will result in non-acceptance of the exhibits and forfeiture of the entry fees.
14. Prize money will be paid out by the Chief Steward in the pavilion sections, or at the Secretary's Office, but prize money unclaimed or cheques not presented within three months of the Show will revert to the secretary.
15. Judges or stewards may transfer any exhibit from any one class to another.
16. The right is reserved to reject any exhibit/s which may be considered not of sufficient merit to be displayed.
17. The Society reserves the right to adjudicate on any point or points which may be under dispute, and the society's decision shall be final.
18. Notwithstanding anything contained in the rules and conditions, the committee may, at their discretion, alter any condition, cancel or substitute and/or any event or class in the schedule if they consider it necessary to do so.
19. Competitors in ring events must have their horses in the assembly yard no later than 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the event. Any exhibitor not being present with his/her horse at the time of roll call, which will take place five minutes before the commencement of the event will not be permitted to compete in such event. After the roll call the steward in charge of the assembly yard will advise the ringmaster of the number of competitors present and ready to compete in the event about to take place.
20. Galloways or ponies in any class for which a prescribed height is a condition, must be measured by the official measurer. The official measurer will be in attendance at the showgrounds from 3.00pm to 4.00pm on the day prior to the Show. When measuring a Galloway or pony an allowance of half (1/2) of an inch (or 13mm) is to be made for shoes.

## **MISCELLANEOUS**

1. The committee reserves the right to prescribe the dimensions and regulate the position of all signs and generally to direct the arrangements or articles on exhibition with consideration to secure harmony and an attractive appearance. No advertisement or notice for which permission has not been received from the committee is permitted on any stall or building.
2. The distribution of printed or other matter or goods by any other space holder or exhibitor must be confined to the area (detailed in the space contract) occupied by such space-holder or exhibitor. Any other person distributing or selling printed or other matter or goods about the grounds or buildings is liable to confiscation of the articles or goods and to ejection from the grounds.

3. No exhibitor or his employees will be permitted to make unseemly noises that may be considered a nuisance in calling the attention of the visitors to his exhibits, and any exhibitor or attendant who may be guilty of distributing advertising cards or other notices that may be considered immoral, objectionable, or in any way infringes the privileges disposed by the committee, shall forfeit his spaces and all other privileges and shall be removed from the grounds.
4. If any person wilfully destroys any property within the grounds of the association or gains admission to the said grounds' contrary to the rules of the association, or by-laws thereof, will be prosecuted and dealt with as the law directs.
5. The committee reserves the right to call for a sworn declaration from any exhibitor in regard to exhibitor entered for exhibition or otherwise.
6. Without in any way hurting the power conferred by any other by-law or rule of the association, the chairperson of the ring committee or his/her deputy may order any person who is not an exhibitor to leave the ring or assembly yard. If such person fails or refuses to do so, the chairperson of the ring committee may remove the offender and for that purpose may enlist the aid of other persons. In addition to the above regulations, conditions applying to sections are printed therein, and exhibitors are requested to familiarise themselves with special conditions applying to their entries.
